YOUTH CONFERENCE

October 29, I had an opportunity to open a youth conference at Bwemba, one of our church planting sites. The theme of the conference was "Maintaining Godliness in the Last Days."

My opening sermon was from 2 Timothy 3:1-17 where Paul writing to Timothy talks about difficult times in the last days as people will be full of godlessness. Paul commands Timothy to avoid ungodly people who have an appearance of godliness but deny its power. Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked. And Paul warns that those who desire to live godly lives in Christ will suffer. I finished my sermon with a call for them to remain in the Word.

During the conference we also had an opportunity to do door-to-door evangelism with the youth. This was an opportunity to teach them skills of evangelism as every believer is called to be a witness. Youth from Dzuwa, Kapangalika, Bwemba and Mponela attended the conference.

CHILDREN EVANGELISM

"Do Not Hinder Them" - Jesus

Matthew 19:13-15: Then children were brought to him that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked the people, but Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." And he laid his hands on them and went away.

One of the areas that is greatly overlooked is children's ministry. As a church at Mponela we started a weekly children's Bible story and fellowship time. We noticed that many children in our community are simply roaming around aimlessly in the afternoon and this is one way of sharing the good news of the Lord Jesus Christ with them.

The Joy of Church Planting

When I was asked to lead church planting efforts in Dzuwa from 2013-2014, I had no idea where this was going to end. Since then it has been a joy experience the work of the Lord in my own life and the life of others. And due to several groups interested with the Reformed faith, it is best for me to invest my time teaching young men who can start Bible study groups in several areas.

Two Churches Planted in One Month

October has been a very unique month in my life and ministry. Two churches have been planted: Linthembwe and Msampha Reformed churches under the leadership of Mponela Reformed Church.

What led to the planting of Linthembwe church is the attendance of 1 family which was attending worship services at Mponela. Due to the long distance, as a leadership team we decided that it would be in the best interest of the family to investigate possibility of planting a church there. After visiting the area, a number of people were interested.

We went to do a gospel conference there and at the end of the conference 30 people decided to join the church. There are weekly Bible lessons and Westminster Larger Catechism lessons being conducted.

Msampha Reformed Church

Another church which has been planted is Msampha. We did not have any member at Msampha but there were a number of people who were interested to attend a Reformed church.

People had been asking me to consider planting a church there since last year. When I brought the issue to the leadership at Mponela we decided to wait until there is enough interest. Some of the people had been following my weekly radio program and that ignited even more interest. That's when we decided it was time to have a gospel conference in the area. Currently 35 people are attending our weekly gatherings and Bible study. Lessons are also being taught from the Westminster Shorter Catechism.

Please pray that we can find two potential candidates to provide pulpit supply at Linthembwe and Msampha for the next two years.

How to Plant a Reformed Church

As the need plant to confessional Reformed churches in our country keeps growing, was privileged to go through a URCNA church planting manual with pastors and elders at Mponela as well as in Zomba at the Reformed Presbyterian Church Bible School.

At Mponela 14 people attended while in Zomba there were 17 students who are also directly involved with church leadership responsibilities in their respective local churches.

During both meetings, it was noted that most of our church planting endeavors are not properly planned and biblically questionable. My next assignment will be to translate the church planting manual into our local language Chichewa with the aim of training many church planters in the vernacular language.



2022 Church Planting Plans

As 2021 comes to an end, there is a possibility that two more church plants will be launched next year. We have two other members at Mponela who come from a longer distance and between now and next year we will be investigating a possibility of establishing a church plant there.

In Ntchisi there is also a possibility that they can establish another church plant due to the longer distance some of the members to walk in order to attend church services there. Please pray that the Lord would grant us wisdom and strength as we solidify these plans.

Please also pray that the Lord would bring capable men who are passionate for the gospel and committed to the Reformed faith to help us in this ministry that the Lord has entrusted to us.

More importantly, please pray that we might be faithful and committed to this work.

Every Tuesday I am privileged to meet a group of young men pursuing pastoral ministry. Wilicks Laston who has been an intern since 2019 is now heading a church plant in Ntchisi as he pursues further studies with Miami International Theological Seminary by extension.

Two other men have joined us: Jolly Kamwendo and Davison Lawe. They both hold a diploma in theology from Pastors Theological Training Institute and Teen Missions respectively. Beginning next year Lord willing, we will also be joined by two young men members of Dzuwa and Kapangalika churches who recently finalized their basic certificate studies with Logos Institute.

One crucial aspect of church planting is getting the right people committed to the task. Please pray that as we seek to interact with more young men, that the Lord will bring to us those whom He has called to the task of preaching the gospel.
